#### **«The Nagasaki Consultation Center for Foreign People is Now Open»**

People from foreign countries who live in Nagasaki Prefecture can receive advice by phone or email in person about matters such as their status of residence (visa), work, daily life, etc., so that they can live safely and securely in this area.



- ★When: Monday to Saturday, 9AM to 5PM (Closed on Sundays, Public Holidays, and from Dec 29<sup>th</sup> to Jan 3<sup>rd</sup>)
- ★Where: 1<sup>st</sup> Floor, Dejima Koryu Kaikan (inside the Nagasaki International Association)
  2-11 Dejima-machi, Nagasaki City

★How it works: There are two staff members who can provide advice directly (in English and Vietnamese) over the phone or e-mail in person. For languages that the staff cannot directly deal with, portable translation devices and a 3<sup>rd</sup> party multilanguage interpreting call center will be used to deal with foreign languages.

★Supported Languages: English, Chinese, Korean, Vietnamese, Nepalese, Indonesian, Thai, Tagalog, Portuguese, Spanish, and others, for a total of 18 languages.
